ADMISSIONS PROCESS

Admission into Highlands Latin Cottage School Anderson is a 3-step process. Each step moves your student closer towards being an enrolled student at our campus. We work hard to ensure our school is the most effective educational environment for all students enrolled. We review all applications and interview families to make sure we can create the best partnerships possible. STEP 1: APPLICATION

You will need to fill out one on-line application per family. Once your application has been received along with a \$50 Application Fee, we will contact you to schedule an interview.

STEP 2: INTERVIEW

In order to determine if the environment and curriculum will be effective for both parties involved, we will interview all prospective families. After your application has been received, we will contact you to schedule a time to interview you and/or your student.

STEP 3: REGISTRATION

Once your interview is complete, we will notify you about your enrollment status. Placement is not guaranteed until you receive notification of admission and we receive your \$150 Registration Fee per student. The \$50 Application Fee will be applied to your Registration. At this point, we will open class registration for your student, and he will be officially enrolled.
