Latin I (*First Form Latin and Lingua Angelica*; 1 credit)

Latin II (*Second Form Latin* with readings from *Lingua Latina*; 1 credit; **Prerequisite:** *First Form Latin*)

Classical Studies I: Ancient Greece* (*The Book of the Ancient Greeks, The Iliad, The Odyssey*; 1 credit)

Classical Studies II: Ancient Rome** (*The Book of the Ancient Romans, The Aeneid*; 1 credit; **Prerequisites:** Must have read and studied *The Iliad* and *The Odyssey*)

Christian Studies: Ancient World* (*The Book of the Ancient World*; 1 credit)

Christian Studies: The Story of Christianity** (*The Story of Christianity*; 1 credit)

Medieval Literature (*The British Tradition I: Poetry, Prose, and Drama; Beowulf; Sir Gawain and the Green Knight; A Midsummer Night's Dream; Canterbury Tales*; 1 credit)

Medieval European History (*A History of Medieval Europe, primary sources*; 1 credit)

Logic I (Traditional Logic I; .5 credit)

Note: The Classical and Christian Studies courses must be taken in conjunction.
