Highlands Latin School Beaufort has a rigorous course of studies that leads to a high school diploma of incomparable quality. Transcripts include course descriptions so that colleges may understand the nature of the curriculum and the level of reading the graduates have experienced. Each credit represents one year's work in a 3-5 hour course. The requirements below are for students wishing to graduate with an HLSB diploma. Students who transfer in after 10th grade will receive credit for previous coursework.

❖ In SC, the four core subjects of Math, Science, English (Literature and Composition), and Social Studies are required every year for homeschooling, regardless of how many credits a student has earned in each of those subject areas.

❖ High school credits can be earned in 8th grade.

❖ SC operates on a mandatory 10 point grading scale for homeschooling (ex. 90-100 is an A).

❖ If students follow this four year high school path they will have met credit requirements for all classes except computer science (which can easily be done at home) and electives. Although HSLB will offer many different courses that will qualify as electives (Classical studies, and more) where the electives come from will vary from student to student.

❖ The Latin sequence will vary from student to student, but every student in HSLB will learn Latin every year.

❖ Students taking high school courses with HSLB will receive transcripts from Highlands Beaufort with course descriptions to include with their cover letter/transcripts for college applications.

❖ Students who want to pursue the diploma program must apply, commit and meet the standards and requirements of the program.

❖ **SC requires a total of 24 credits for a high school diploma. SC Requirements are as follows:**

U.S History and Constitution: 1

Economics: 0.5
