ADMISSIONS PROCESS

Admission into our Highlands Latin Cottages Schools is a three-step process. Each step moves your student closer towards being an enrolled student at our Northeast Wisconsin campus. We work hard to ensure our school is the most effective educational environment for all students enrolled. We review all applications and interview families to determine if we can create the best partnership possible. Please note that completing an application and family interview is not a guarantee for admission. STEP 1: APPLICATION

You will need to complete one application per family. Once your application has been received along with a non-refundable Application Fee (\$50 per Traditional student, \$75 per Simply Classical student), we will contact you to schedule an interview.

STEP 2: INTERVIEW

In order to determine if the environment and curriculum will be effective for both parties involved, we will interview all prospective families. During the interview, we will meet with both parents and students. We will also administer academic and readiness assessments to prospective students.

STEP 3: REGISTRATION

Once your interview is complete, we will notify you about your enrollment status. Placement is not guaranteed until you receive notification of admission and we receive your non-refundable \$150 Registration Fee per student. The \$150 Registration Fee will be applied to your Tuition balance. At this point, we will open class registration for your student(s), and they will be officially enrolled.
